To my knowledge, the only time your medical insurance would pay for this testing is if your child had a severe medical problem, like a severe brain injury or stroke.

Otherwise, if you simply want your child tested for a possible diagnosis of a learning disability, you would pay for that testing out-of-pocket.

The diagnosis from this testing would have to be one that appears on the DSM-V and is consistent with the ADA (Americans with Disabilities ACT) in order to receive accommodations on the SAT or the ACT.
